Activity: The ED₅₀, as measured by the ability to stimulate proliferation of mouse 3T3 fibroblasts is typically 1 ng/mL, corresponding to a Specific Activity of 1,000,000 IU/mg.

Storage Buffer: Lyophilized from 20mM sodium phosphate in absence of any carrier protein.

Storage Instruction: Store at -20°C. Aliquot the product after reconstitution to avoid repeated freezing/thawing

cycles.

Gene Summary: The protein encoded by this gene is a member of the platelet-derived growth factor family. The four members of this family are mitogenic factors for cells of mesenchymal origin and are characterized by a motif of eight cysteines. This gene product can exist either as a homodimer (PDGF-BB) or as a heterodimer with the platelet-derived growth factor alpha polypeptide (PDGF-AB), where the dimers are connected by disulfide bonds. Mutations in this gene are associated with meningioma. Reciprocal translocations between chromosomes 22 and 7, at sites where this gene and that for COL1A1 are located, are associated with a particular type of skin tumor called dermatofibrosarcoma protuberans resulting from unregulated expression of growth factor. Two alternatively spliced transcript variants encoding different isoforms have been identified for this gene. [provided by RefSeq]
