Background

The reactivity of the antiserum is directed to the Fc subunit of subclass IgG1. It does not react with other IgG2, IgG/Fab fragments, IgM and IgA or any non-Ig protein in guinea pig serum, as tested by immunoelectrophoresis and double radial immunodiffusion. In precipitating techniques as immunoelectrophoresis and radial immunodiffusion to identify the presence of IgG1 in guinea pig serum and other body fluids or to determine its concentration.

Source

Pools of purified normal IgG1 isolated from pooled guinea pig serum. Freund's complete adjuvant is used in the first step of the immunization procedure.

Product

Delipidated, heat inactivated, lyophilized whole antiserum. No preservative added, as it may interfere with the antibody activity. Total protein and IgG concentration in the antiserum are comparable to those of pooled normal sheep serum. No foreign proteins added.

Applications

Immunoprecipitation. In immunoelectrophoresis use 2 μ l or equivalent against 120 μ l antiserum. In double radial immunodiffusion (Ouchterlony) use a rosette arrangement with 10 μ l antiserum in a 3 mm diameter centre well and 2 μ l serum samples (neat and diluted) in 2 mm diameter peripheral wells.

Cross Reactivity

This IgG fraction is not species-specific since inter-species cross-reactivity is a normal feature of antisera to immunoglobulins. Cross-reactivity of this product has not been tested in detail.

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Specificity

Precipitating polyclonal Sheep antiSerum to Guinea Pig IgG1, subclass specific.

Storage

The lyophilized antiserum is shipped at ambient temperature and may be stored at +4°C; prolonged storage at or below -20°C. Reconstitute the lyophilized antiserum by adding 1 ml sterile distilled water. Dilutions may be prepared by adding phosphate buffered saline (PBS, pH 7.2). Repeated thawing and freezing should be avoided. If a slight precipitation occurs upon storage, this should be removed by centrifugation. It will not affect the performance of the antiserum. Diluted antiserum should be stored at +4°C, not refrozen, and preferably used the same day. Lyophilized at +4°C--at least 10 years. Reconstituted at or below - 20°C--3-5 years. Reconstituted at +4°C--7 days.
