

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
Additional info

Application note: IHC-P: Antigen Retrieval: Boil tissue section in Tris/EDTA buffer (pH 9.0).* The dilutions indicate recommended starting dilutions and the optimal dilutions or concentrations should be determined by the scientist. Storage instruction: For continuous use, store undiluted antibody at 2-8°C for up to a week. For long-term storage, aliquot and store at -20°C. Storage in frost free freezers is not recommended. Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles. Suggest spin the vial prior to opening. The antibody solution should be gently mixed before use. Background: Bax belongs to the BCL2 protein family. BCL2 family members form hetero- or homodimers and act as anti- or pro-apoptotic regulators that are involved in a wide variety of cellular activities. This protein forms a heterodimer with BCL2, and functions as an apoptotic activator. The association and the ratio of BAX to BCL2 also determines survival or death of a cell following an apoptotic stimulus. This protein is reported to interact with, and increase the opening of, the mitochondrial voltage-dependent anion channel (VDAC), which leads to the loss in membrane potential and the release of cytochrome c. The expression of this gene is regulated by the tumor suppressor P53 and has been shown to be involved in P53-mediated apoptosis. Multiple alternatively spliced transcript variants, which encode different isoforms, have been reported for this gene. [provided by RefSeq, Dec 2019]

Immunohistochemistry: Formalin-fixed and paraffin-embedded Ovarian cancer tissue stained with anti-Bax antibody [SQab1736] at 1:1600. Antigen Retrieval: Boil tissue section in Tris/EDTA buffer (pH 9.0).



Western blot: 10 μg of OVCAR-3, A549, HT-29, SH-SY5Y and LnCap cell lysates stained with anti-Bax antibody [SQab1736] at 1:1000 dilution.
